### **Director's Note**

A Wrinkle in Time has been a beloved favourite of mine since early childhood. I devoured all Madeleine L'Engle's books, and I think it's fair to say that her philosophies played a significant part in shaping my character as I grew.

I never really expected to be able to produce this show on the stage. I didn't think it lent itself well to a large cast, and Riverfront requires a larger cast, most of the time. Finding this ensemble-centred version of the script has really been a game-changer, and let me tackle the project that has always frustrated me in stage and screen productions. Something that works so well on paper has never quite worked for me when taken off the page. I thought this might be our best shot, and was willing to give it a try. I wanted so much to share something I love so much with our kids, and to see them exposed to these titanic themes of love conquering evil, and how vastly powerful the force for good can be against darkness.

Our ensemble forms and articulates both Meg's insecurities and external pressures and worries, and then forms the insidious voice of It. The work to include choral line delivery into a script with tight timing has been a significant challenge. Our Senior plays are intended to help develop specific skill sets in our students - choral work is a very important theatrical skill, and we are glad for this challenge.

I love Meg Murry. I love her uniqueness; her awkwardness, the depth of her frustration, her suspicious, her anger and her hurt, and, unfailingly, her willingness to move out of her comfort zones and to risk everything for the people she loves. One of the things that has excited me the most in this production is to take Meg Murry as she appears throughout the story - a fractured, self-mistrusting, broken self, and represent her by **four distinct characters all personifying aspects of her personality, in a Greek chorus of dissonance, suspicion, hurt and anger.** As we work through the story, the different pieces of Meg all move into new stages of trust, finally uniting into one whole and healed Meg. I thank my team of Megs for trusting me with this bizarre casting choice, and for working together with dedication to bring her to life.

I am profoundly grateful to Lee Taylor and to Connor Porcellini for being my dedicated crew, keeping our ensemble organised and retaining their blocking through its many iterations. I don't think I'd have made it through a very overwhelming fall this season without Lee stepping up in a huge way to help me direct this show. Kayla, Bruce and Meredith, thank you so much for getting the kids to move and sound the way they need to for maximum impact, and for giving me the underlying sound track I needed. Finn, thank you for many back-cramping hours painting our beautiful sets, and for everything else you do every week. John, thank you for building my sets. Special thanks to Cary and Nick for creating Aunt Beast to Finn's original design! There are a number of unique costumes in this show. We'd be lost without our costume team, and everyone who works behind the scene to make our shows possible. We are so blessed.
